TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, Greeting:

Know ye, This is an Acknowledgment and Notice of Acknowledgment made under Utah Code Sections 72-5-309 through 310 inclusive, that the grant of the United States of America of “the right of way for the construction of highways over public lands, not reserved for public uses” under United States Revised Statutes 2477 (43 U.S.C. Section 932 (repealed October 21, 1976, with proviso recognizing the validity of rights-of-way already established)) was accepted for and on behalf of the State of Utah and its political subdivision Juab County as it pertains to the highway located in Juab County known as GRANITE CANYON ROAD; County Road Number: 17121801; State Geographic Information Database (SGID) Road Identification Number: RD121098. Total road length is 3.74 miles more or less.

The reason for this Acknowledgment and Notice of Acknowledgment includes, but is not limited to, the fact that the road was constructed, mechanically, or by continuous use as a public highway for a period of at least ten years, over public lands not reserved for public uses, prior to the earlier of (a) the October 21, 1976 repeal of R.S. 2477 or (b) the date the servient estate was reserved for public uses.

This Acknowledgment and Notice of Acknowledgment applies only to the segments of the road that traverse land owned by the Bureau of Land Management, United States Department of the Interior, and does not apply to segments of the road that traverse land owned by any other person or entity. The State of Utah and its political subdivisions reserve the right to make further acknowledgments and notices of acknowledgment with regard to road segments that traverse land owned by other entities, including the United States of America, through one or more of its agencies.

A printed copy of a map showing the location of the road in said county is appended hereto as “Attachment 1,” a printed copy of representative photos of the road is appended hereto as “Attachment 2,” a printed copy of a description of the beginning and ending points of the entire road together with a list of Townships, Ranges and Sections that may be traversed by the road in said county is appended hereto as “Attachment 3,” and a printed copy of the Road Centerline Description Cover Page(s) is appended hereto as “Attachment 4.” The Appendices listed in “Attachment 4” that contain the actual road centerline descriptions are incorporated herein by reference. Affidavits provided by individuals familiar with the road are appended hereto as “Attachment 5.”

A printed copy of this Acknowledgment and Notice of Acknowledgment, together with its Attachments and Appendices, may be viewed and/or obtained at the office of the Utah State Archives.

An electronic copy of this Acknowledgment and Notice of Acknowledgment, together with its Attachments and Appendices, may be viewed and/or downloaded as read-only PDF (Portable Document Format) files via the

Internet at <http://recorded2477roads.utah.gov>.

The owner of the servient estate in the land underlying the road-segments subject to this Acknowledgment and Notice is believed to be the United States of America through one or more of its agencies. Any of such agencies or any other person with a servient ownership claim or a competing dominant estate right-of-way ownership claim, may file a petition in the State District Court for Salt Lake County for a decision regarding the correctness of this Acknowledgment. A claimant shall file a petition within sixty (60) days after receipt of this Notice.

In Witness Whereof, I, John Harja, the official designee of the Governor of the State of Utah, in conformity to the laws of the State (Utah Code Sections 72-5-308 through 310 inclusive), have caused this Acknowledgment and Notice of Acknowledgment to be made.

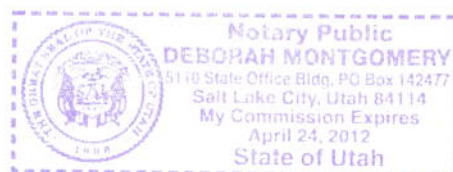

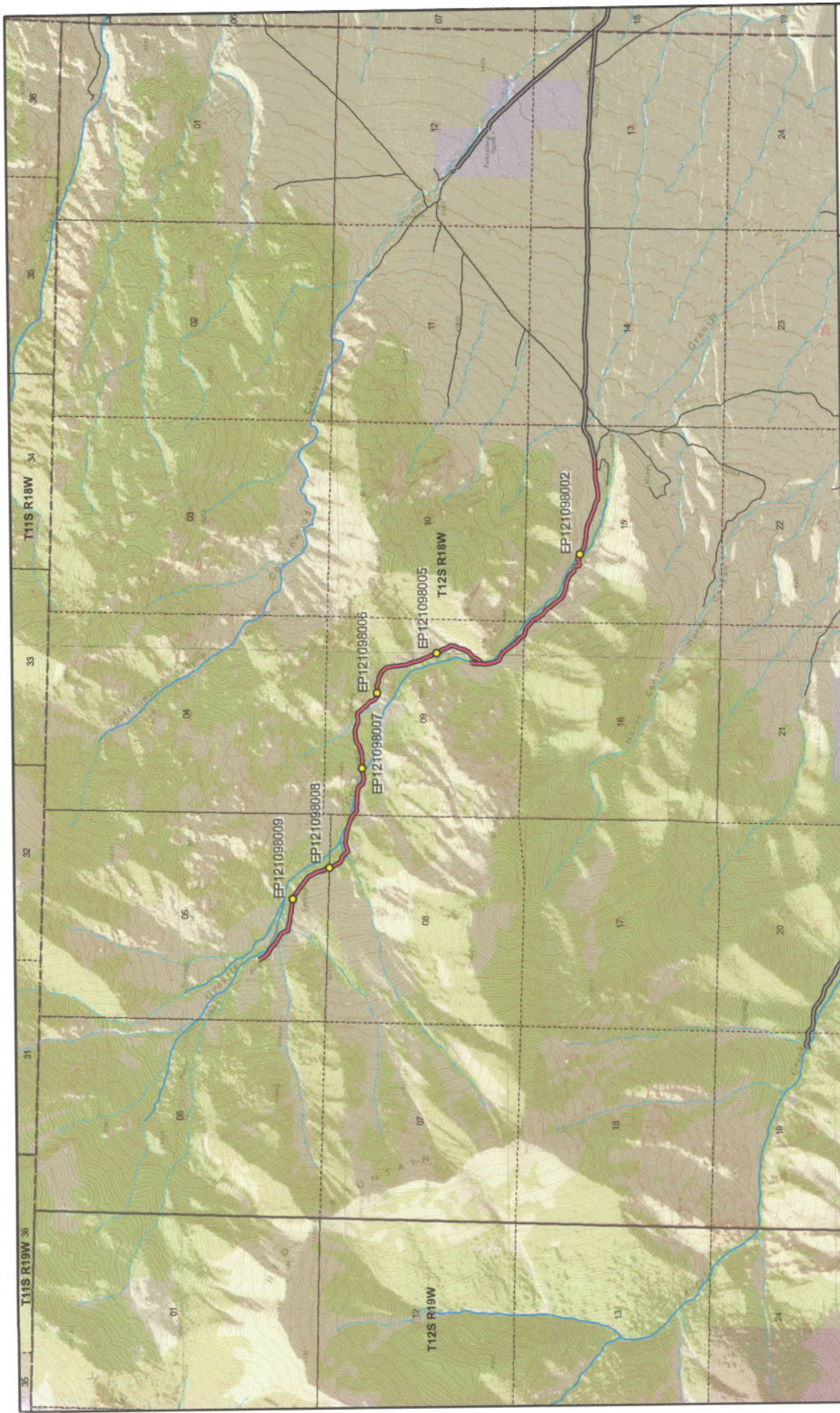

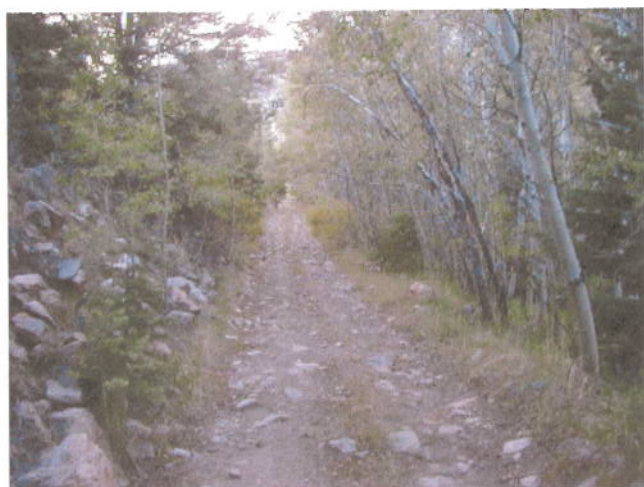

Granite Canyon Road

Ronald C. Jones, being first duly sworn, deposes and states as follows:

1. I am an adult competent to testify about the matters set forth below based upon my personal knowledge.
2. I have observed Granite Canyon Road in Juab County since the late 1940s or early 1950s and the road descriptions herein pertain to that road.
3. I am familiar with the indicated road because I was born and raised in Juab County and I am familiar with the roads throughout the County. I also worked as the County Road Supervisor for thirty-eight years, beginning in 1949 and retiring in 1987.
4. It is the reputation in the community that this road was used by the settlers, ranchers, sheepmen, and others of Snake Valley since at least as early as the 1880s, and has been continuously used until BLM closed a portion of the road in 2002 or 2003.
5. As County Road Supervisor I was often out in the West Desert supervising the grading and maintenance of the roads in that area. Sometime between 1949 and 1952, while working on the roads in Snake Valley, I took a county bulldozer and repaired the washouts along Granite Canyon Road.
6. By reputation in the community, the residents of Snake Valley have used Granite Canyon since the late 1800s for maintaining irrigation structures, hunting, fishing, and recreation. Beginning in the late 1940s or early 1950s I personally observed individuals using the road for maintaining irrigation structures, hunting, fishing, and recreation.
7. By reputation in the community, the road has been open to the public for all to use, to

come and go as they pleased, since the late 1800s and continuing until the time of its partial closure by the BLM in 2002 or 2003. By my personal observation since the late 1940s or early 1950s, the road was open to the public for all to use until the BLM's recent closure of the road.

8. By reputation in the community, travelers on the road since the late 1800s and continuing thereafter included those who went by horseback and horse-drawn wagon. In more recent years, both before and after 1966, I observed individuals using horses, automobiles, and trucks to travel the road.

9. By reputation in the community, construction and maintenance of the road since the late 1800s was performed by the residents of Callao and the surrounding area as needed to keep the road open and negotiable for its many uses. Besides passing horse-drawn wagons or livestock over the roadway, that maintenance included removing rocks and vegetation by hand labor. By my personal observation since the late 1940s or early 1950s, maintenance of the road prior to 1976 was accomplished using heavy machinery. I personally graded Granite Canyon Road well before 1976.

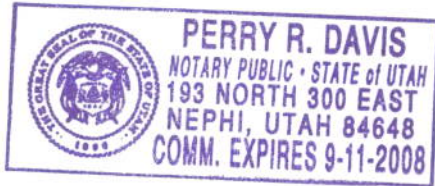
10. When I first used and observed the road it ran the same route as it did at the time of its partial closure by the BLM in 2002 or 2003.

11. By way of further particulars regarding this 2477 highway as it stood at the time of the BLM closure, it began at its junction with the Callao-Partoun Road and ran westward before ending in Granite Canyon. The actual traveled portion of the road was approximately fifteen feet wide for most of its length, but ranged from ten to twenty feet in width. The surface of the road was native dirt and rock.

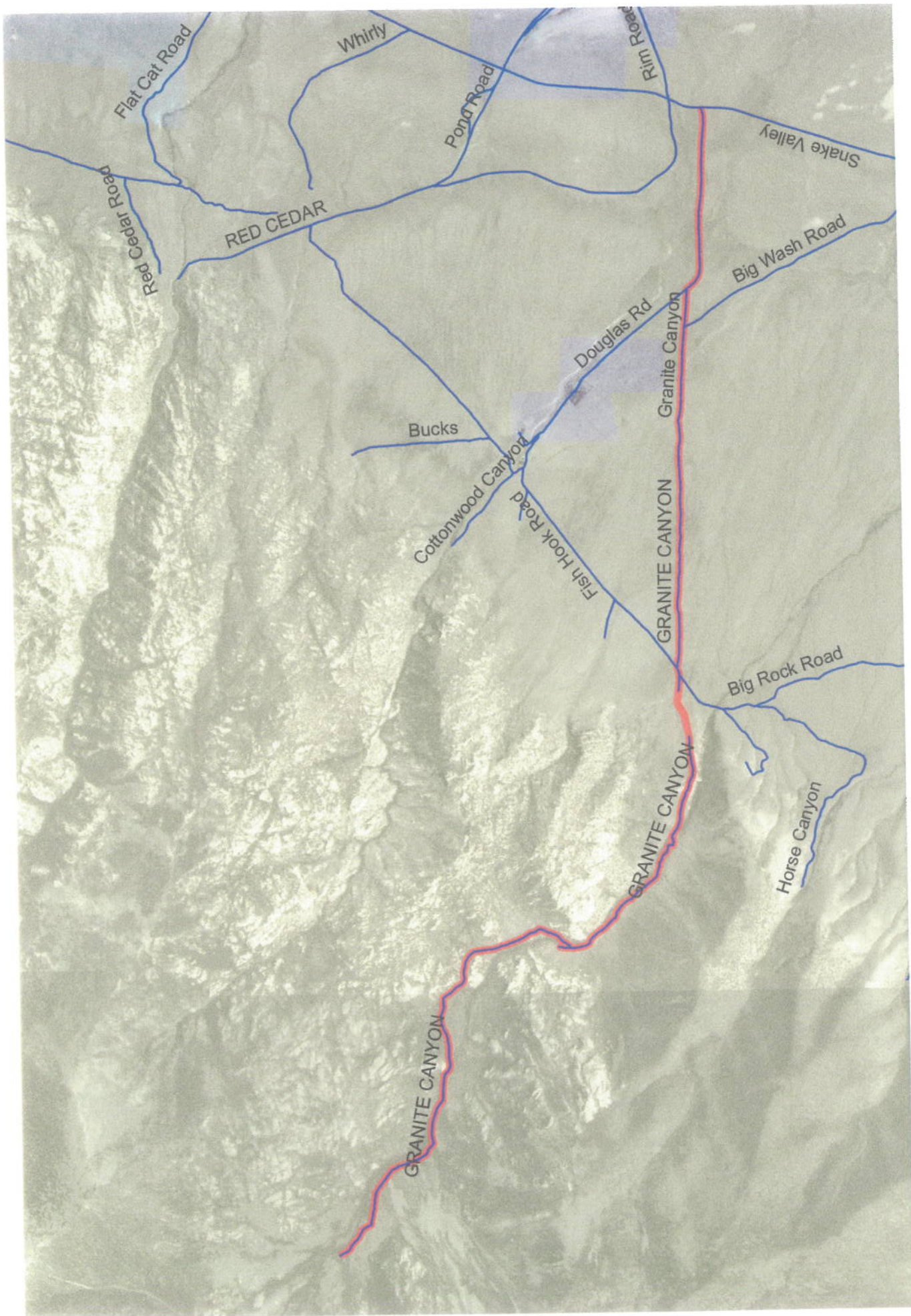

Granite Canyon Road

Wesley Ray Lewis, being first duly sworn, deposes and states as follows:

1. I am an adult competent to testify about the matters set forth below based upon my personal knowledge.
2. I have observed Granite Canyon Road in Juab County since the 1950s and the road descriptions herein pertain to that road.
3. I am familiar with the indicated road because I have lived in the area from 1950 to 1951, and from 1977 to the present. I work on the Juab County Road Crew and maintain the roads in the western portion of the County.
4. It is the reputation in the community that this road was used by the settlers, ranchers, sheepmen, and others of Snake Valley since at least as early as the 1880s, and was continuously used until the recent BLM road closure.
5. When we lived here in 1950, my family drove a 1947 Chevrolet sedan about two miles up Granite Canyon.
6. Currently, Juab County regularly grades the road up to the mouth of Granite Canyon.
7. By reputation in the community, the residents of Snake Valley have used Granite Canyon Road since the late 1800s for irrigation, fishing, hunting, and recreation. In the early 1950s and the 1970s I personally used the road for camping and picnicking and I observed others using the road for irrigation, fishing, hunting, and other forms of recreation.
8. By reputation in the community, the road has been open to the public for all to use, to come and go as they pleased, since the late 1800s until the recent BLM road closure. By my

personal observation in 1951 and the 1970s onward, the road was open to the public for all to use.

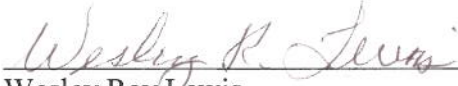
9. By reputation in the community, travelers on the road since the late 1800s and continuing thereafter included those who went by horseback and horse-drawn wagon. In more recent years, both before and after 1966, I observed individuals using automobiles and trucks to travel the road.

10. By reputation in the community, construction and maintenance of the road since the late 1800s included passing horse-drawn wagons or livestock over the roadway and removing rocks and vegetation by hand labor. Both before and after 1976 I have personally cleared tree limbs and debris out of the portion of the road that runs up Granite Canyon. From the time I began working with the Juab County Road Crew in 1977 I have regularly graded the road up to the mouth of the canyon.

11. When I first used and observed the road in the 1950s it ran the same route as it did when I last traveled the road.

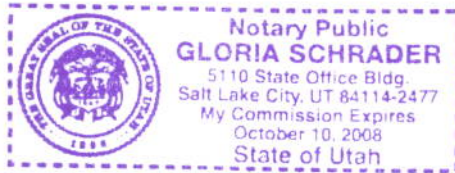

By way of further particulars regarding this right-of-way as it stood at the time of the BLM closure, it was a Class D road beginning at its junction with the Callao-Partoun Road and running westward to its terminus in Granite Canyon. The actual traveled portion of the road was approximately fifteen feet wide for most of its length, but ranged from ten to twenty feet in width. The surface of the road was native dirt and rock.

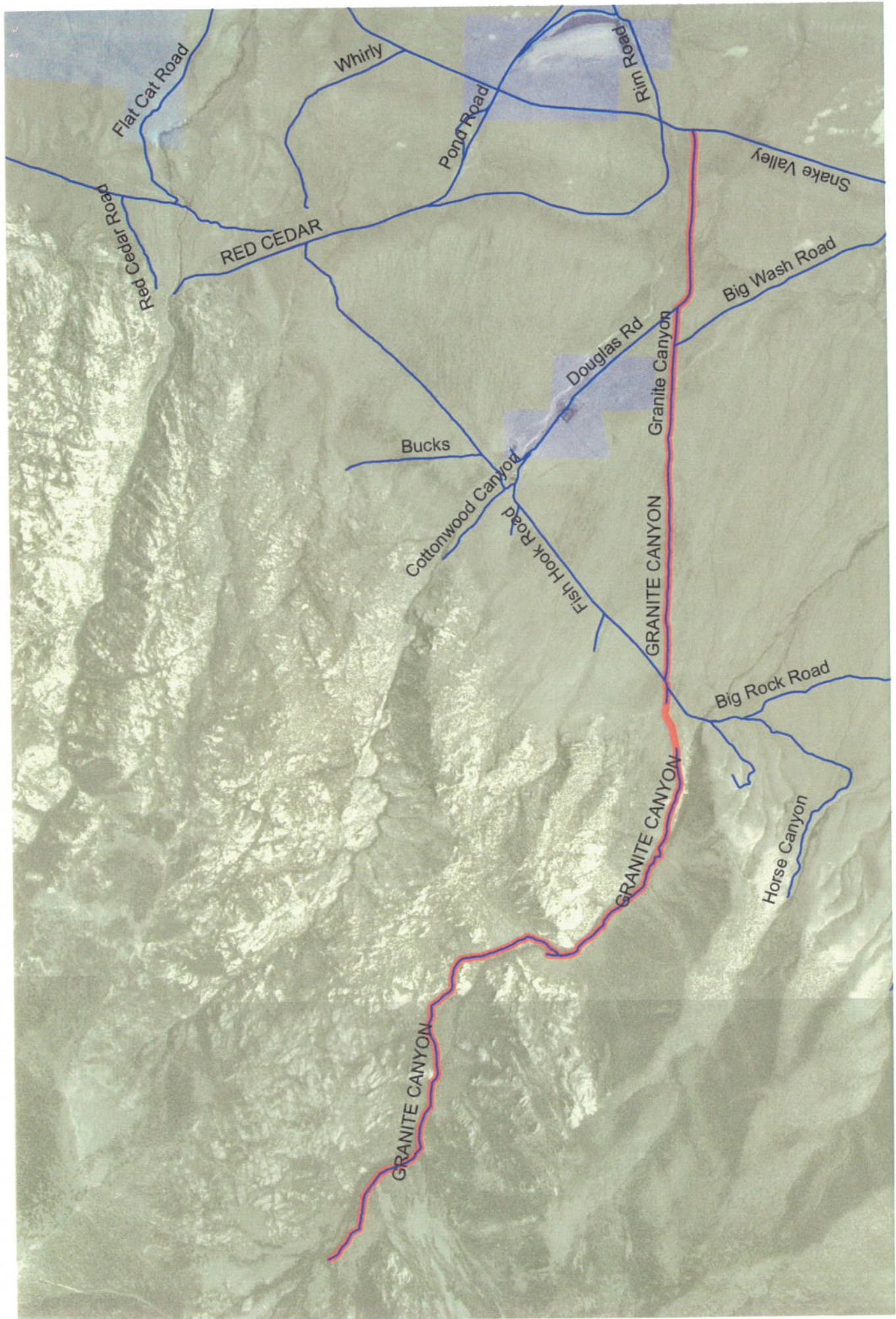

Cecil R. Bates, being first duly sworn, deposes and states as follows:

1. I am an adult competent to testify about the matters set forth below based upon my personal knowledge.
2. I have observed Granite Canyon Road in Juab County since the 1930s and the road descriptions herein pertain to that road.
3. I am familiar with the indicated road because I was born and raised in the area and I am familiar with the area roads and their uses. My parents and grandparents helped settle the area.
4. It is the reputation in the community that this road was used by the settlers, ranchers, and others of Snake Valley since at least as early as the 1880s, and was continuously used since that time until the BLM closed a portion of the road in 2002 or 2003.
5. By reputation in the community, there was, prior to my birth in 1914, a sawmill located several miles up Granite Canyon. By that reputation, a lot of logs were dragged down Granite Canyon Road during that time period.
6. In the late 1920s and early 1930s I herded sheep at the head of Granite and Red Cedar Canyons. During that time period we used horse-drawn camp wagons for our sheep camps. At that time Granite Canyon Road was a passable two-track road. The Bagleys and Parkers also ran sheep in the area at that time.
7. Since the 1930s, both before and after 1966, my family and I spent a lot of time in Granite Canyon and used the Granite Canyon Road many times for recreation. Prior to 1966 we

drove cars, 1930s versions of two-wheel drive pickups, a 1948 truck, and various other two-and four-wheel drive vehicles up and down Granite Canyon Road.

8. Since the 1930s, both before and after 1966, we camped, fished, hunted, and hiked in Granite Canyon. Over the years, I have observed many people using Granite Canyon for recreational purposes. Granite Canyon was always full during the deer hunting season. During one year, prior to 1966, Granite Canyon was so crowded that we had a hard time finding a place to camp and had to travel further up the canyon in order to camp for the night.

9. There were some places in Granite Canyon that it took some work to get over, but we were always able to successfully travel the road. Long before 1976 we frequently used a shovel to clear rocks and repair washouts, as needed, in order to travel the road.

10. Travelers I observed on the road since at least as early as the 1930s and continuing thereafter included those who went by horseback, horse-drawn wagon, automobile and truck.

11. Construction and maintenance of the road since at least as early as the 1930s was performed by the residents of Snake Valley and the surrounding area as needed to keep the road open and negotiable for its many uses. In addition to passing horse-drawn wagons or livestock over the roadway, this maintenance also included removing rocks and vegetation by hand labor. Long before 1976, I personally filled in low spots and cleared limbs, rocks, and debris from Granite Canyon Road near a location along the road known as "Hogsback." Prior to 1976 I also observed county graders grading the road up to the mouth of Granite Canyon.

12. When I first used and observed the road it ran the same route as it did when I last traveled the road.

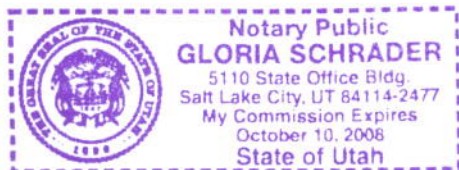

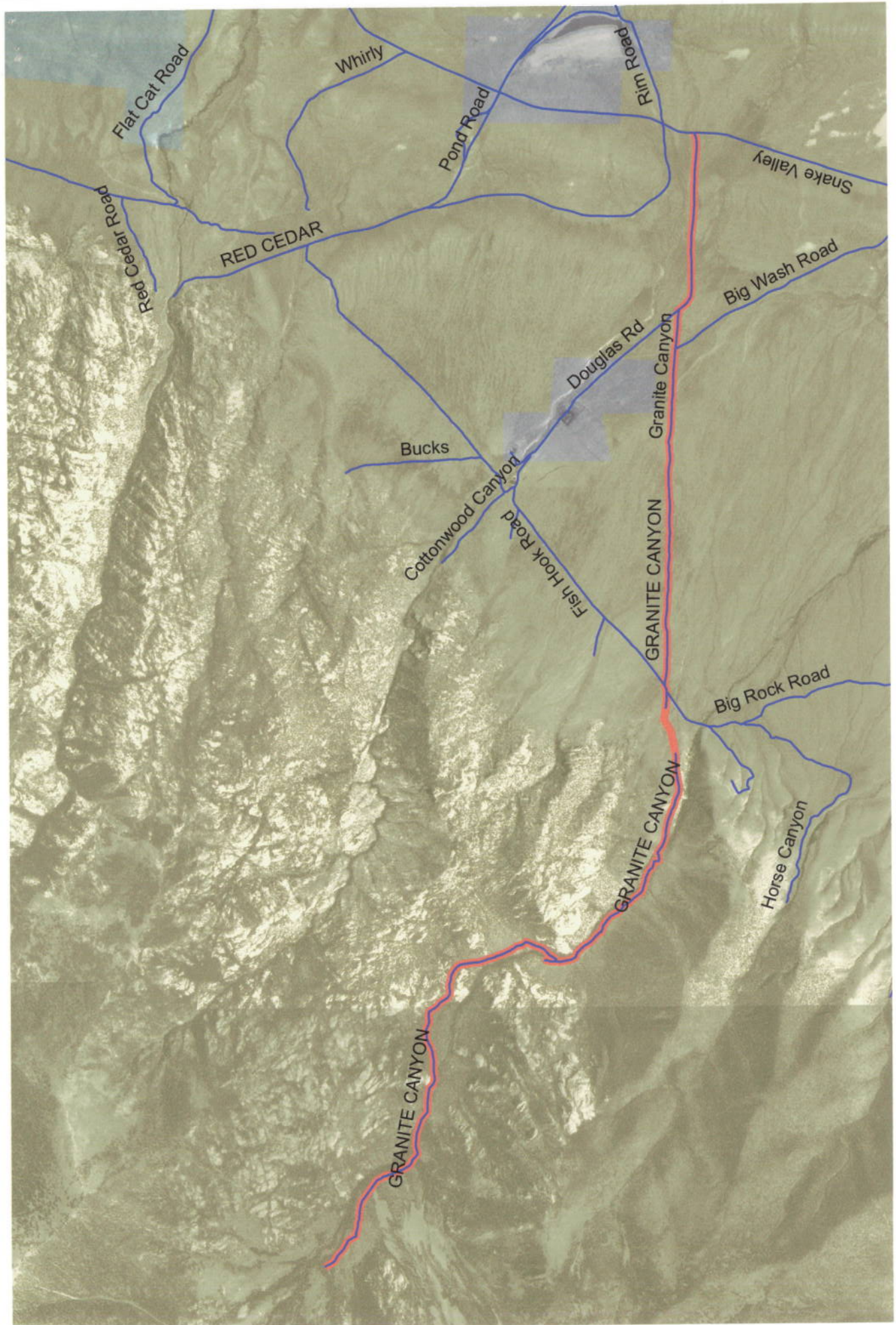

Granite Canyon Road

Tracy W. Bronson, being first duly sworn, deposes and states as follows:

1. I am an adult competent to testify about the matters set forth below based upon my personal knowledge.
2. I have observed Granite Canyon Road in Juab County since the 1960s and the road descriptions herein pertain to that road. (See incorporated Exhibit attached.)
3. I am familiar with the indicated road because I worked on and later managed the Trout Creek and Granite Ranches from 1966 to 1972. I participated in the purchase of the Granite Ranch in 1985. These ranches have a history going back to the late 1800s. I know the history of the area roads and their uses.
4. It is the reputation in the community that this road was used by the settlers, ranchers, sheepmen, and others of Snake Valley since at least as early as the mid-1880s, and has been continuously used since that time until BLM closed a portion of the road in 2002 or 2003.
5. By reputation in the community the road in Granite Canyon has been in existence since the mid-1880s. By that reputation the early settlers of the valley, and particularly the owners of these ranches, began the process of diverting the water from these canyons. By that reputation water from Granite Canyon was diverted in the early 1900s through a wooden aqueduct that brought water from Granite Canyon to the Granite Ranch Reservoir. I still have some of the wooden remains of that aqueduct here on the ranch. In the 1920s, by reputation in the community, the aqueduct was converted to an 18 inch cement pipeline.
6. Since the mid-1880s, by reputation in the community, Granite Canyon has been a

place of recreation for the residents of Snake Valley. By reputation in the community, Camp Ethel, in Granite Canyon, has been a favorite camping and picnic spot for the people in Snake Valley since at least the 1930s. Since at least as early as the 1930s, by reputation in the community, Granite Canyon has also been a favorite hunting spot for valley residents and people from outside the valley.

7. By my own observation since 1966, Granite Canyon has been a favorite camping and picnic spot for many members of the community. When I first came to the area in the mid-1960s I drove, and saw others drive, two -wheel drive vehicles past Camp Ethel clear to the top of the canyon.

8. By reputation in the community, there was a sawmill located in Granite Canyon during the 1920s or 1930s. I observed a lot of evidence of that mill when I came to the valley in 1966.

9. By reputation in the community, at one time the Falkenburgs had an ore mill in the mouth of Granite Canyon. They are also reputed to have had a mine there. After arriving in the valley in 1966 I periodically visited and observed the mill building until it burned down in the mid-1980s. During that time period I also observed a big ramp at the mill site and a pretty good sized piece of concrete located just below our irrigation headgate. When I came here in 1966 there was still a shaker, or wolvery table, some ore bins, and a crusher at the mill site.

10. By reputation in the community, Granite Ranch ran cattle in Granite Canyon since at least as early as the 1920s. I ran cattle up there in the 1960s during the summer time. During that time period I observed people from the ranch going up and down that road nearly every day to watch our cattle and protect them from the large numbers of predators in the area.

11. By reputation in the community the road was open to the public for all to use, to come and go as they pleased since at least as early as the 1880s.

12. By my observation, since 1966 until the time of its closure by the BLM in 2002 or 2003, the road was open to the public for all to come and go as they pleased.

13. Since the 1880s, by reputation in the community, the road was used for ranching (both sheep and cattle), hunting, logging, camping, fishing, recreation, law enforcement, prospecting, mining, sightseeing, and traveling in and through the area.

14. By my observation since 1966 until the recent closure of the road in either 2002 or 2003, the road was used for ranching (both sheep and cattle), hunting, logging, camping, fishing, recreation, law enforcement, prospecting, mining, sightseeing, and traveling in and through the area.

15. Since the 1880s, by reputation in the community, travelers on the road included those who went by horseback and horse-drawn wagon.

16. By my own observation since the 1960s until the time of its closure by the BLM in either 2002 or 2003, travelers on the road included those who went by horseback, automobiles, and trucks. This road was used almost constantly during the summer months.

17. Since the 1880s, by reputation in the community, construction and maintenance of the road was performed by removing rocks and vegetation by hand labor and by passing horse-drawn wagons or livestock over the roadway, or some combination thereof. By that same reputation, beginning in the 1920s or 1930s, construction and maintenance of the road was performed by hand labor and mechanical equipment in addition to the passing of motorized vehicles over the roadways.

18. By my own observation since 1966 until the time of the road's closure by the BLM in either 2002 or 2003, construction and maintenance of the road was performed by graders and other heavy machinery. In 1968 or 1969 I used a bulldozer and fixed the road clear to the head of

Granite Canyon. In 1970 or 1971 I took a six-Wheel Austin-Westin grader and repeated the process. During the time I worked on the ranches (1966-1972) I performed additional maintenance on the road whenever it was necessary.

19. When I first used and observed the road in 1966 it ran the same route as it did in 2002 or 2003 when the BLM closed the road.

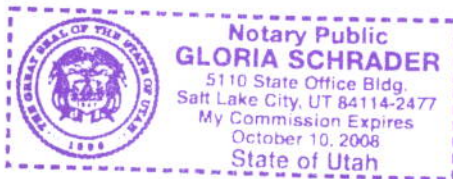

By way of further particulars regarding this right-of-way as it stood as of 2002 or 2003, the road began at its intersection with the Callao-Partoun road and followed a westward path leading through Granite Canyon. The actual traveled portion of the road was approximately fifteen feet wide for most of its length, but ranged from fifteen to twenty feet in width. The surface of the road was native dirt and rock.

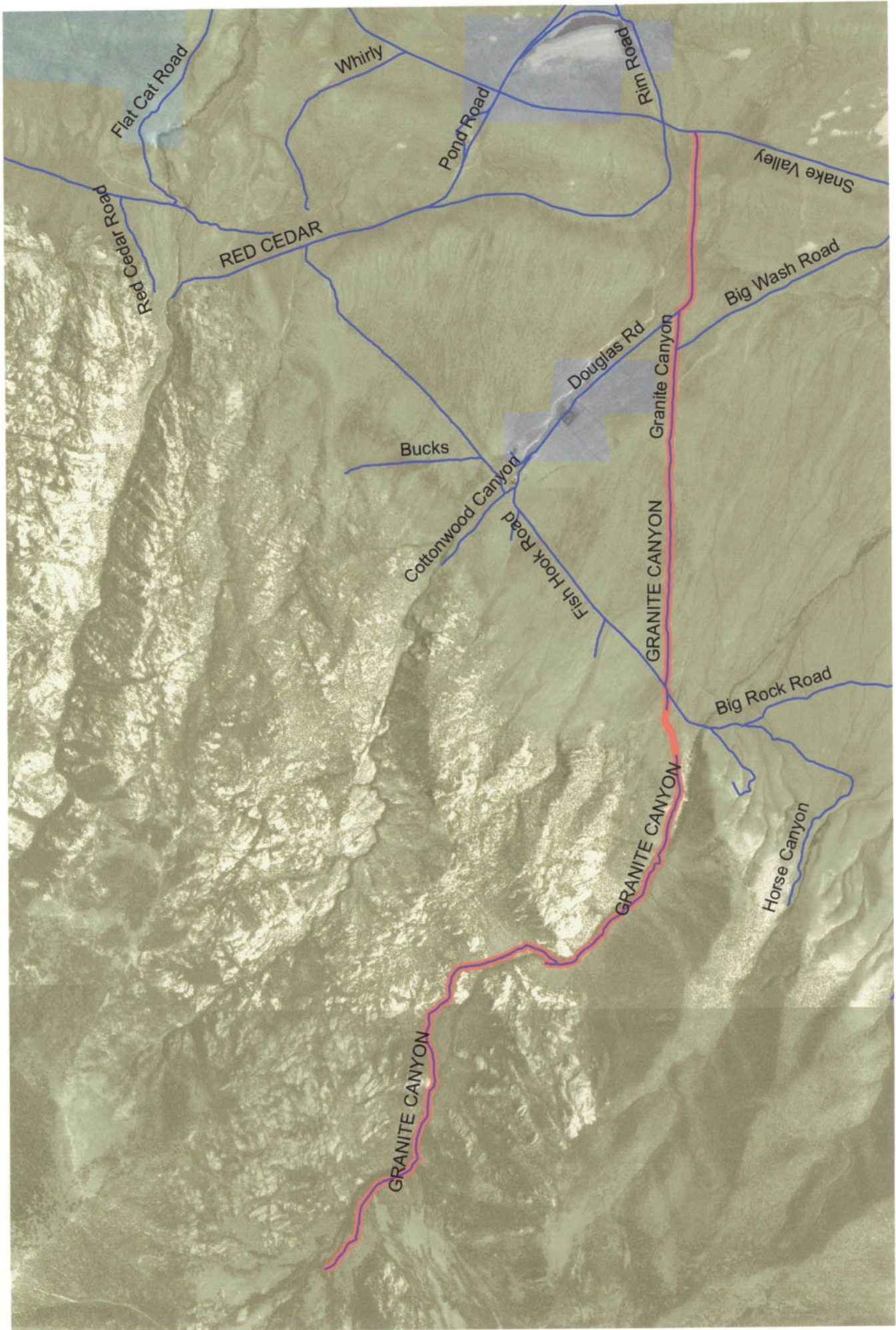

The following description is based upon the geographic coordinate system using the NAD83 Datum. The source is GPS mapping grade data as indicated in the metadata and/or the transportation data model of the State of Utah Geographic Information Database (SGID).

The road-segment itself is the monument that is identified by its physical presence on the land. The location of said physical presence is closely approximated by mapping grade Global Positioning System (GPS) data. Said data are checked against the corresponding gray-scale 1-meter Digital Orthophoto Quadrangles published by the United States Geological Survey (USGS) to verify a reasonable degree of accuracy. In circumstances where accurate satellite signal acquisition is not possible, such as deep, narrow canyons or under a canopy of dense foliage, or where very sharp curves in the road make accuracy questionable, such portions of the road were digitized from the corresponding gray-scale 1-meter Digital Orthophoto Quadrangles published by the United States Geological Survey (USGS).
