I, CLYDE R. NAYLOR, being first sworn, deposes and states as follows:

- I am an adult competent to testify about the matters set forth below based on my personal knowledge.
- My educational background includes a B.E.S. degree in Civil Engineering and M.S. degree in Structural Engineering, both from Brigham Young University.
- 3. I am currently a member of the American Public Works Association where I was the past chapter president and a past National Institute for Transportation Executive Council Member, a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers, and a member of the Utah Council of Land Surveyors.
- 4. I have been the Utah County Surveyor from January 1979 to December 31, 2006, the Utah County Engineer from January 1980 to the present, and the Utah County Public Works Director from January 1991 to the present. During these time periods, I have been personally familiar with Utah County's construction and maintenance activities on county roads, including the "B"road know as the Lewiston Road that runs from State Road 73 southwesterly, west and northwesterly to Manning Canyon Road. A map of the road is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

- The road is known as Utah County "B" road # B 897. The road is a dirt road located in Township 6 South, Range 3 West. The 2.15 miles length of the road, located in Sections 14, 15 and 23 of Township 6 South, Range 3 West runs across federal property.
- As the Utah County Surveyor, I have supervised a center line survey of the segment of the Lewiston Road believed to be in the ownership of the Bureau of Land Management. The center line description is as follows:

SEGMENT 2:

Commencing at a point located at the center line of Lewiston Road, said point being located North 8936.32 feet and West 7294.35 feet from the Northwest Corner of Section 25, Township 6 South, Range 3 West, Salt Lake Base and Meridian; thence the following along said center line: South 25° 14' 32" East 283.66 feet; South 31° 22' 33" East 160.00 feet; South 37° 17' 59" East 125.80 feet; South 39° 35' 23" East 8996.73 feet; South 39° 16' 59" East 2117.21 feet.

- 7. Pursuant to Utah Code Ann. § 17-23-1 and during the time I served as the Utah County Surveyor, I was the designated record holder for all the surveys and maps made within the county. The records of the Utah County Surveyor show that the road has existed since 1955, and has been utilized and maintained as a county "B" road since that time. The attached copies of documents taken from the Utah County Surveyor's records identify the roads existence:
 - a. The General Highway Map of Utah County, dated 1955, prepared by the
 Utah Department of Transportation, shows the Lewiston Road as a county

"B" road that runs from State Road 73 southwesterly, west and northwesterly to Manning Canyon Road, which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A1".

- b. The Utah County map, prepared by L. D. Green, County Surveyor, and revised in September of 1966, shows the county road, which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A2".
- c. The United States Government survey map for Mercur, Utah dated 1968, shows the location of the road within Sections 14, 15 and 23 of Township 6 South, Range 3 West, which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A3".
- d. The general highway map of Utah County, prepared by the Utah State
 Department of Highways, dated 1975, shows the "B" road as a county road
 that runs from State Road 73 southwesterly, west and northwesterly to
 Manning Canyon Road, which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A4".
- The general highway map of Utah County prepared by the Utah
 Department of Transportation, dated 1985, shows the county road, which is attached as Exhibit "A5".
- f. The Road Map of Utah County, Sheet # 4, created November 21, 1995, shows the relationship the road has with the federal property in the area, which is attached as Exhibit "A6".
- g. The official County Road Map of Utah County, Sheet #4, adopted by the Board of County Commissioners on October 30, 1996, shows the road running across the federal properties, which is attached as Exhibit "A7".

- The current County Atlas, page 5, titled Cedar Valley, shows the Lewiston h. Road as it traverses federal property, which is attached as Exhibit "A8".
- i. The surveyed description for Segment 02 of the Lewiston Road has been plotted on an Aerial Photo taken in 1993 to verify the roads existence and is attached as Exhibit "A9".
- 8. At no time during my tenure with the County did it undertake any procedure to abandon or vacate its right-of-way on the road.
- I have had the County records searched for any evidence of reservations on this road and 9. none have been found.

- I am an adult competent to testify about the matters set forth below based on my personal knowledge.
- 2. From 1958 to 1988 I was employed with Utah County in the Roads Department where I was an operator/truck driver, supervisor over bridges and culverts, and worked in maintenance and oiling of roads. During that time period, I was personally familiar with Utah County's construction and maintenance activities on county roads, including the road known as Lewiston Road that runs from U.S. Highway 73 intersecting and combining at Manning, Utah and continue to run together to Mercur, Tooele County, Utah. A map of the road is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".
- 3. Utah County has performed the following maintenance activities on this road during my employment with the County: the road was a graded gravel road maintained to the summit where the County ends. The road was closed by Mercur at their intersection in Manning, Utah because Mercur oiled its main access road in Tooele County, Utah. After that the road was merely graded to that intersection.
- 4. All acts of the County regarding this road was, to my knowledge, consistent with it's status as a public highway.
- 5. It is the reputation in the community that this road was used by the public since at least as

early as when Johnson's army was stationed in Fairfield, Utah, and has been continuously used since that time.

- At no time during my employment with the County undertake any procedure to abandon or 6. vacate its right-of-way on this road.
- 7. Use of the road since before 1966 and before any federal reservation included, but were not limited to, providing the main mine access to Mercur, Utah. Manning, Utah is an old mining town which had a large population in its day.
